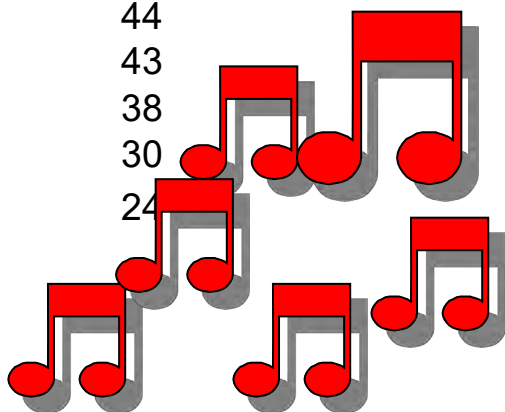

**A House Divided: Compliance vs. Surrender**

Teri H. and Joanne C.

Rob has been sober for a year, attends meetings one to three times per week, calls his sponsor occasionally, is still working on his fourth step, has received tickets for speeding, has been reprimanded at work for a surly attitude, and has received divorce papers from his wife.

Sue has been sober for a year, attends meetings three or more times per week, calls her sponsor regularly, has completed her steps, drives without getting frustrated anymore, enjoys her work, and her co-workers seek her out for work and life advice. Her husband and children enjoy her company and are planning a family vacation to visit relatives.

What led to the difference in the outcomes for these two AA members? A possible explanation is this: Rob is compliant, but Sue has surrendered.

When we are compliant, we are convinced that our drinking must stop, that we have had enough of the hangovers, missed work, fights, DUIs – we can no longer deny the facts. The pain is acute. Our sincerity is obvious. We can, and do, list all the reasons we need to get sober. We can list all the bad behaviors we intend to change about ourselves.

Compliance is saying “Yes” on the surface, but “No” inside. A technical term is *defiant individuality*, in AA we often say *terminal uniqueness*. We feel different from others, we do not incorporate the principles of AA in everyday life. We believe if we just don’t drink, life will change. We are a house divided. We are conflicted. Inside, we know we are not honest, we have lingering feelings of guilt. We agree but we do not give ourselves to making real change. While we are in this state of compliance, we are blocked from true surrender.

Acceptance starts at the beginning, the first step. Awareness of being an alcoholic is different from admitting it. We become receptive to change, to new ideas, to cooperation. In the Promises, we find that we cease fighting. Fighting alcohol? Yes, but more. We stop, fighting everyone and everything. Other drivers, co-workers, family, other AA members...you name it.

No longer are we nodding in agreement just to keep the peace. Disagreements are no longer win-lose. We look for ways we can all agree. So, a car cut you off on the road. Maybe the driver is stressed, have just lost his/her job, or are on the way to the hospital. There is room in his world for all our beliefs, wishes, dreams.

We *force* ourselves to comply, we *allow* ourselves to surrender.

Teri: After 36 years of continuous sobriety I stopped going to meetings, and I lost my conscious contact with a Higher Power. I also frivolously rejected what the fellowship afforded me in terms of support, connection and camaraderie. All of this contributed to the moment when I had no defense against the first drink. What I have discovered is that I was only compliant because, for most of those years, I went to meetings, worked the steps, and stayed somewhat active, but there was a part of me that I withheld. However, since getting sober again in early 2015 I have surrendered to the fact that not only am I an alcoholic, I must remain dedicated and fearless in my actions to maintain my sobriety, work the steps and seek a conscious contact with God.

Joanne: I have been sober for 35 years and was immediately compliant. Working through the steps led to acceptance of my alcoholism, but it was a gradual process over several years before I experienced it in all my affairs. In my second year, at a step meeting, I heard in the sixth step that all our fears are of losing something or not getting something we want. It was an “aha” moment. That began the process for me for acceptance and letting go of my anger. I have had many, many “aha” moments, even to this day.
